Indis - Mr A said that he had reached there the previous week.

Sir - Last Saturday Mr A asked, "will you accompany me to Konojia tomorrow?"

Indis - ~~Last~~ Saturday Mr A inquired if I would accompany ~~me~~ ^{him} to Konojia the next day.

The ordinary infinitive is not preceded by "to" when it is the object of the following verbs; -

Bid: I will bid him run to you

Can: I can go. dare: I dare do all that may become a man

do: I do not ~~know~~ know the time.

feel: We can feel the wind blow

have: I can not have you come today.

hear: We can hear the bird sing.

let: Let him sing.

Make: Make the man sit down

May: May I go?

Must: you must take care

Need: We need not speak to him

See: We saw the house fall

Shall: Shall we return.
