P. 147 "Little minds are tamed," &c. from Trinity.

P. 320 "For by old proverbs it appears," &c. from Swift,  
 which is from his A Pastoral Dialogue.

In the case of

P. 336 "Strike whilst the iron is hot" from Webster's  
Westward Ho, no act and scene is given;  
 it is in Act II., Scene II.

P. 306. With respect to references to quotations from Couper  
 our author generally gives the lines, but we find  
 no lines given in the case of "To follow foolish  
 precedents," &c. from Couper's Terminus; it is from  
 line 255 et seq.

The author says that "I have, I hope, been able to correct  
 many errors which have crept in through the use of  
 "Observations of Quotations," but I doubt his sincerity.  
 He is not free from the charge of Locke (see Dalbiac,  
 p. 100 top)."

Page 222 "Seven hours to law," &c. from Sir W. Jones is not  
 from his Code in the Punishment of Alcaeus; ludicrously  
 enough the same blunder <sup>is</sup> ~~is~~ committed by Daventry  
 Adams in his Dictionary of English Literature, which ~~is~~ <sup>was</sup>  
 which may be traced to his carelessness computation  
 from Bartlett's invaluable "Familiar Quotations."  
 See Chamber's Cyclopaedia of Eng. Literature, vol. II. p. 2.
